You also have the option to record your meeting, which is great for those that need to look back and get a refresher of what happened. Finally, you'll be able to use a feature called breakout rooms where you can divide your participants into several groups. This is great for group projects or those projects that have multiple different teams working on it.

This is an app that works well for both small groups and bigger businesses. Even though there's nothing that says you can only use the app for business purposes, and many people choose to host personal get-togethers. It's worth a try and has plenty of features to meet most needs.

Not only will this let them see what you're seeing, but they can easily follow along. The great thing about this feature is that it's available to everyone in the chat as long as they have permission. ## Video Recording

Easy Invitation

It's super easy to invite people to your meeting and you could even use the group tool to invite multiple people at once. The first way to do this is by emailing everyone a mass email that contains the meeting link and the other way is only emailing the link to a select number of people.
